But at times, he gets overly aggressive on challenging in the neutral zone and also left his feet on one play in his own end. He is a good defenseman, but has to work a bit on management outside of the dots at the midget level. He has the feet to do it, but has to temper his challenges. We love his leadership qualities and he is a very coachable kid that listens to suggestions. He is also going to grow more and it just gets more interesting.

is a strong defender with nice upside. His physical game is out and out nasty. He hits in all areas of the ice with intent and is effective. The coverage in D zone is strong in front, he is in position and chops away using his body and the stick to clear the porch and he gets rebounds out, not taking penalties as he does it. He can get a little better on outside coverage. On the attack his game is basic, he see the ice and moves the puck effectively and efficiently with no turn overs. The on ice vision is good, spotting the open man both on the break out and the point. He tends to prefer to keep the outlets up the wing more than go into the middle as an option, but is a tape to tape pass not just firing off the boards. We like David's potential and he is going to get bigger. He is a good reliable player who shows up to play.

Appears to have a flaw in his stride, needs more knee bend and extension - with his natural power he can lengthen his push - Big hitter, not shy about using lumber - Good communication with D partner and Center in DZone - inconsistent pass accuracy (attempted stretch passes) - would like to see him "pin-and-contain" in Dzone, loose gaps defending cycle, he will hand-check or cross-check (3rd period penalty) instead of eliminating time & space - wins net front battles, excels at clearing rebounds, boxing out and lifting sticks - good OZone decisions: when to get puck deep, when to scissor-cycle (beautiful back-door feed on PP for team's 6th goal) - David has a hard, accurate slap shot - he is most effective when he keeps things simple
